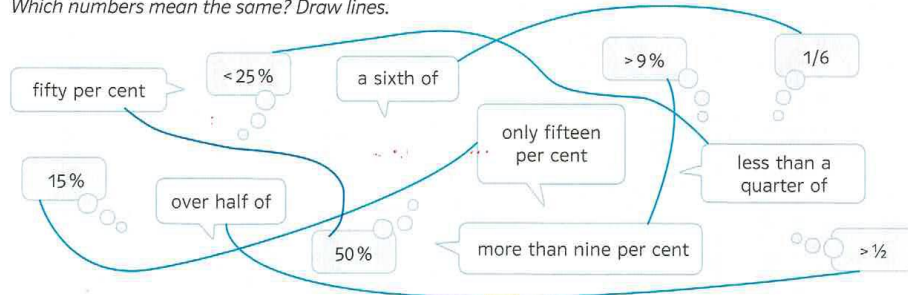

The topic of the survey was 'Americans on vacation in Germany'. 75 students answered questions about travelling in Germany. The questions were about which German city they would like to visit and which activities they would like to do. First of all, you will see that almost half of them would like to go to Munich and only 33 per cent would like to see Berlin. One sixth of the students would like to visit Heidelberg and less than six per cent want to spend some time in Hamburg.

Read the text and complete the grid.

Enjoying German food and beer¹ was the most popular activity. 44% wanted to do that. The second most popular activity was visiting the Oktoberfest or other beer festivals. Almost a quarter of the students would like to do this. This was probably because in Germany you can drink beer at the age of 16. 17 per cent wanted to go on a boat trip on one of Germany's rivers. And 16 per cent wanted to drive as fast as possible on a German highway. But do they know that you have to be 18 to drive a car? So the results show that going to the Oktoberfest and drinking beer were the most popular things to do.

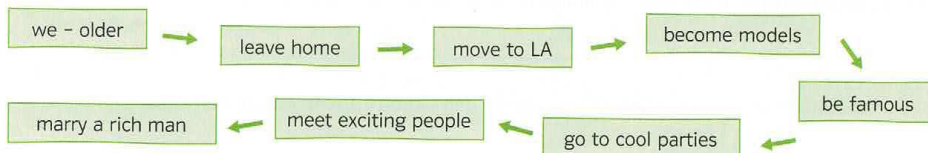
